From Your Principal


The Ashley Drew Leadership Project has inspired many amazing accomplishments from our young students at home, at school, in our community and the world!

Hearing about the long-term effects of the earthquake in Haiti, they knew they wanted to help children in Haiti who were suffering from cholera. Once they got their project approved they were on their way! With the support of Miss Brown, School Counselor, the girls further developed their project. They created their bracelet designs, advertised at an all school assembly, involved others in selling and making the bracelets and raised our awareness of the cholera epidemic in Haiti.

These young leaders inspired our staff and students to help people in the world who do not have fresh water or an abundance of doctors to help them when they are sick. They will contribute over \$500 to the North West Medical Team. We are so proud of these student leaders!


